PREPARATORY SCHOOL

CURRICULUM & GRADING SYSTEM NOTES

All students complete a rigorous college preparatory curriculum that instills in our students the skills and content knowledge necessary to succeed at the undergraduate level.

In addition to our college preparatory curriculum, students may have the opportunity to enroll in AP and Honors courses based on a recommendation process which encompasses multiple criteria. We do not offer dual enrollment courses, but students may elect to take college-level courses on their own. Grades for these courses are not published on the transcript. See course guide for detailed information about the recommendation process and a description of courses offered at UMS-Wright.

UMS-Wright awards grades on a numerical scale of 0-100. Only grades in academic courses are used in calculating the 100 point GPA. Any grade below 70 is considered a failing grade at UMS-Wright. For year-long courses, credit is awarded based on the average of first and second semesters.

As of summer 2021, students may not receive higher than a seventy (70) for a summer school course taken for credit recovery purposes. Grades from Advanced Placement and honors courses are weighted when computing the grade point average and are reflected in the cumulative GPA. The course grades themselves are not weighted. Academic weight for AP courses adds six points, and honors courses add four points for the 100 point GPA. Both AP and honors courses are given one point weight credit when calculating the cumulative weighted 4.0 GPA.

AFFILIATIONS

UMS-Wright is accredited by the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

UMS-Wright also has affiliations with the National Association of College Admission Counselors (NACAC), College Board, Educational Records Bureau, Alabama Association of Independent Schools, Cum Laude Society, and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

UMS-Wright is also a member of The National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS).

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Project Engage is a week-and-a-half winter term experiential learning course for Upper School (9-12) students. Students have the opportunity to pursue topics of special individual interest and collaborate with other students and teachers. A major goal of Project Engage is to expose and prepare students for greater college and career opportunities.

Project Engage offers course options that are campus-based, local, within the United States, and abroad. The focus of Project Engage is to teach the whole student in a beyond-the-classroom atmosphere.

GLOBAL SEAL OF BILITERACY

New to UMS-Wright, 13 students earned a Global Seal of Biliteracy in Spanish, and 4 earned a Global Seal of Biliteracy in French for the 2021-2022 school year.

The ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages (AAPPL) is an assessment of standards-based language learning across the three modes of communication (Interpersonal, Presentational, and Interpretive) as defined by the National Standards for Foreign Language Learning. The AAPPL assesses Interpersonal Listening/Speaking, Presentational Writing, Interpretive Reading, and Interpretive Listening, and ratings are assigned according to the ACTFL Performance Descriptors for Language Learners.

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMATM PROGRAM

As of the 2023-2024 school year, students are able to earn an AP Capstone DiplomaTM through College Board with successful completion of AP Seminar and AP Research.

COVID NOTES

2020-2021

In the 2020-2021 school year, UMS-Wright offered three Pathways for students. Pathway One was in-person learning at the school, while following health protocols and participating in daily health screenings. Pathway Two was short-term and offered students a virtual learning experience while in guarantine. Pathway Three was a fully remote/virtual instruction opportunity. Students followed a regular school day schedule, logging in to each class to participate remotely in live instruction. Students in Pathway Three were not allowed to participate in any extracurricular activities sponsored by UMS-Wright.
